Hunt Regional Medical Center offers a PMSR/RRA program with an emphasis on forefoot and rearfoot reconstructive surgery, and trauma. Hunt Regional is located just outside of the DFW metroplex, with residents participating in surgical cases both in Greenville and through the metroplex giving residents a wide variety of cases, including 35 supervising physicians with whom to gain knowledge from. Secondary institutions include Baylor Surgicare at North Garland, Medical City Dallas, Baylor Rockwall Surgery Ctr., Eminent Medical Center, Peak Health Surgery Ctr., Methodist McKinney Hospital, Craig Ranch Surgery Ctr., Texas Health Surgery Ctr. at Craig Ranch/Dallas, Oak Point Surgical Hospital, North Central Surgical Hospital and UTSW Medical Center.

Our program offers residents to complete the following rotations: anesthesiology, behavioral science, emergency medicine, general surgery, infectious disease, orthopedic surgery, pathlogy, physical medicine and Rehab, plastic surgery, podiatric office, podiatric medicine, podiatric surgery, radiology, and wound care.

Academics include weekly meetings, bimonthly practical labs in suturing, ankle fixation, forefoot osteotomies, external fixation, taping, strapping, and saw bones, monthly journal club, cadaver labs, workshops, and Present lectures. Residents also attend post-op clinic every Monday as a chance to follow patients through their post operative course, as well as long term follow up. Clinical work also grants residents the opportunity to provide patients with routine care. While on call, residents will see adult and pediatric patients presenting with open fractures of all kinds, including ankle fractures, Lis Francs fracture/dislocations, calcaneal fractures, diabetic infections, etc., with all ankle trauma offered

topodiatry. Surgical cases include bunion hammertoes, lesser ray surgery, I&D's, ankle fractures, ankle arthroscopy, Charcot reconstruction, pediatric and adult flatfoot reconstruction, tendon transfers, amputations, Achilles repairs

and more. Rotations in medicine, emergency room, pathology, general surgery, orthopedics, and wound care are done at Hunt Regional.

Salary Structure: PGY3 \$56,410.00, PGY2 \$53,495.00, PGY1 \$50,579.00 annually. Benefits include health insurance, lab

coats, book stipend up to \$500.00 annually, CME up to \$2,500.00 annually, including annual ACFAS meeting to present posters/papers. Other benefits include paid time off and sick leave. the program takes 2 residents each year.

The Podiatric Medicine & Surgery Residency (PMSR) training program at the UT Health Science Center at San Antonio (UTHSCSA) is one of the oldest programs in the United States and was the first podiatry program to be fully integrated within a state funded academic health science center(1972). Alumni of the program have become notable leaders in clinical care & academics throughout the United States. Podiatric Medicine & Surgery is a Division in the Department of Orthopaedics. The primary locations for training are the University Hospital, South Texas Veterans Health Care System, Texas Diabetes Institute, Methodist Texsan Hospital, and other private hospitals and surgery centers where members of our adjunct clinical faculty practice.

Training involves an extensive combination of inpatient and outpatient services with excellent surgical training in limb salvage, plastic surgery, trauma, podopediatrics, and reconstructive forefoot, rearfoot and ankle surgery. For those interested, there is opportunity to complete a Masters in Clinical Investigation(MSCI) and interact with worldwide experts in basic science and medicine.

John Peter Smith Hospital is a Level I Trauma Center providing extensive training in rearfoot reconstruction, foot and ankle trauma, amputations, forefoot surgeries as well as the management of diabetic wounds and complications. JPS has over 500 inpatient hospital beds and more than 100 Room beds, our residents manage patients Emergency throughout their course of treatment. As a resident you will have unique opportunity to provide care for our patients throughout the continuum of their medical needs. Handling all isolated foot and ankle issues, our residents see patient in both the Emergency Room and Outpatient Clinic, actively participate in their surgeries, post-operative recovery and ultimately return them back to their normal lives. The Podiatry Residency is based in the Department of Orthopedics at John Peter Smith Hospital with 2 residents per year, 4 full-time staff and more than 200 outpatient clinic encounters weekly. We also have a unique relationship with orthopedics allowing our Orthopedics residents to rotate on our service to receive their foot/ankle experience. During their training at JPS our residents also have the opportunity to branch out to physicians in the Dallas-Fort Worth area for additional procedures. Overall at JPS, our residents are provided an all-encompassing approach to patient care with learning opportunities across multiple specialties services throughout their resident experience.
